1. Work out $\frac{2}{5} + \frac{1}{7}$

$$\frac{2}{5} + \frac{1}{7} = \frac{14}{35} + \frac{5}{35} = \frac{19}{35}$$

$$\frac{19}{35}$$

2. Work out $\frac{2}{3} + \frac{1}{5}$

$$\frac{2}{3} + \frac{1}{5} = \frac{10}{15} + \frac{3}{15} = \frac{13}{15}$$

$$\frac{13}{15}$$

3. Work out $\frac{11}{12} - \frac{5}{6}$

$$\frac{11}{12} - \frac{5}{6} = \frac{11}{12} - \frac{10}{12} = \frac{1}{12}$$

$$\frac{1}{12}$$

4. (a) Work out $\frac{1}{3} + \frac{1}{12}$

$$\frac{1}{3} + \frac{1}{12} = \frac{12}{36} + \frac{3}{36} = \frac{15}{36} = \frac{5}{12}$$

- (b) Work out $\frac{3}{4} \times \frac{1}{5}$

$$\frac{3}{4} \times \frac{1}{5} = \frac{3}{20}$$

$$\underline{\underline{3/20}}$$

5. Work out the value of $\frac{2}{3} \times \frac{3}{4}$

Give your answer as a fraction in its simplest form.

$$\frac{2}{3} \times \frac{3}{4} = \frac{6}{12} = \frac{1}{2}$$

6. Work out $60 \times \frac{2}{3}$

$$\frac{60}{1} \times \frac{2}{3} = \frac{120}{3} = 40$$

7. (a) Work out $1 - \left(\frac{1}{2} + \frac{1}{6}\right)$

$$\frac{1}{2} + \frac{1}{6} = \frac{6}{12} + \frac{2}{12} = \frac{8}{12} = \frac{4}{6} = \frac{2}{3}$$

$$\frac{1}{1} - \frac{2}{3} = \frac{3}{3} - \frac{2}{3} = \frac{1}{3}$$

- (b) Work out

$$12\frac{1}{2} \div \frac{5}{8}$$

$$12\frac{1}{2} = \frac{25}{2}$$

$$\begin{array}{ccc} K & C & F \\ \frac{25}{2} & \div & \frac{5}{8} \end{array}$$

20

(Total 6 marks)

$$\therefore \frac{25}{2} \times \frac{8}{5} = \frac{200}{10} = 20$$

K = Keep
C = Change
F = Flip

8. (a) Work out $\frac{2}{5} + \frac{3}{8}$

$$\frac{2}{5} + \frac{3}{8} = \frac{16}{40} + \frac{15}{40} = \frac{31}{40}$$

$$\frac{31}{40}$$

- (b) Work out $5\frac{2}{3} - 2\frac{3}{4}$

$$5\frac{2}{3} = \frac{17}{3}$$

$$2\frac{3}{4} = \frac{11}{4}$$

$$\frac{17}{3} - \frac{11}{4} = \frac{68}{12} - \frac{33}{12} = \frac{35}{12}$$

$$\frac{35}{12}$$

(Total 5 marks)

9. (a) Work out $\frac{1}{3} + \frac{3}{5}$

$$\frac{1}{3} + \frac{3}{5} = \frac{5}{15} + \frac{9}{15} = \frac{14}{15}$$

$$\frac{14}{15}$$

- (b) Work out $2\frac{1}{4} \div \frac{3}{5}$

$$2\frac{1}{4} = \frac{9}{4}$$

$$\frac{9}{4} \div \frac{3}{5}$$

$$\frac{15}{4}$$

(3)

(Total 5 marks)

$$\therefore \frac{9}{4} \times \frac{5}{3} = \frac{45}{12} = \frac{15}{4}$$

$$3\frac{3}{4} = \frac{15}{4} \quad 2\frac{2}{3} = \frac{8}{3}$$

10. Work out

$$3\frac{3}{4} \times 2\frac{2}{3}$$

$$\frac{15}{4} \times \frac{8}{3} = \frac{120}{12} = 10$$

11. (a) Work out $1\frac{7}{8} \times 5\frac{1}{3}$

$$1\frac{7}{8} = \frac{15}{8} \quad 5\frac{1}{3} = \frac{16}{3}$$

$$\frac{15}{8} \times \frac{16}{3} = \frac{240}{24} = 10$$

.....10.....

(b) Work out $3\frac{1}{2} \div 2\frac{4}{5}$

$$3\frac{1}{2} = \frac{7}{2} \quad 2\frac{4}{5} = \frac{14}{5}$$

$$\frac{7}{2} \div \frac{14}{5} = \frac{7}{2} \times \frac{5}{14} = \frac{35}{28} = \frac{5}{4}$$

.....5/4.....

(Total 4 marks)

12. (a) Work out the value of $\frac{2}{3} \times \frac{3}{4}$

Give your answer as a fraction in its simplest form.

$$\frac{2}{3} \times \frac{3}{4} = \frac{6}{12} = \frac{1}{2}$$

$$\frac{1}{2}$$

- (b) Work out the value of $1\frac{2}{3} + 2\frac{3}{4}$

Give your answer as a fraction in its simplest form.

$$1\frac{2}{3} = \frac{5}{3}$$

$$2\frac{3}{4} = \frac{11}{4}$$

$$\frac{5}{3} + \frac{11}{4} = \frac{20}{12} + \frac{33}{12} = \frac{53}{12}$$

$$\frac{53}{12}$$

(3)

(Total 5 marks)

13. Work out $5\frac{2}{3} - 2\frac{3}{4}$

$$5\frac{2}{3} = \frac{17}{3}$$

$$2\frac{3}{4} = \frac{11}{4}$$

$$\frac{17}{3} - \frac{11}{4} = \frac{68}{12} - \frac{33}{12} = \frac{35}{12}$$

$$\frac{35}{12}$$

(Total 3 marks)

$$4\frac{1}{2} = \frac{9}{2} \quad 1\frac{2}{5} = \frac{7}{5}$$

14. Work out $4\frac{1}{2} + 1\frac{2}{5}$

$$\frac{9}{2} + \frac{7}{5} = \frac{45}{10} + \frac{14}{10} = \frac{59}{10}$$

$$\frac{59}{10}$$

(Total 3 marks)

15. Work out $3\frac{2}{5} - 1\frac{3}{4}$

$$3\frac{2}{5} = \frac{17}{5} \quad 1\frac{3}{4} = \frac{7}{4}$$

$$\frac{17}{5} - \frac{7}{4} = \frac{68}{20} - \frac{35}{20} = \frac{33}{20}$$

$$\frac{33}{20}$$
